East Asia & The Pacific - Teaching and Discipleship - Missionaries - 7 serve on 8 church staffs, 34 church leaders/members mentored, 7 taught in schools, 36 Bible classes taught term, 26 other classes taught, 098 leadership training sessions held, 24 home/cell groups held, 11 women's study/devotional meetings held, 161 youth meetings held and 44 children's ministry meetings held. Evangelism - 7 orphanage visits, 26 missions teams were hosted, 16 crusades held, and 36 street ministry sessions held. Administration - Missionaries - 7 involved in school administration and curriculum development and 7 involved in administration and planning of outreach activities.

Europe - Teaching & Discipleship - Missionaries - 2 serve on 2 church staffs, 5 church leaders/members mentored, 1 taught in school, 1 Bible class taught term, 1 other class taught, 52 leadership training sessions held, 7 home/cell groups held, 15 youth meetings held, 12 children's ministry meetings were held. Administration - Missionaries - 2 serve in school administration, 2 involved in administration and planning of outreach activities.

Administration- Missionaries- 1 served in school administration, 1 was involved in administration and planning of outreach activities.

South America- Teaching & Discipleship-Missionaries- 1 served on 1 church staff, 2 church leaders/members were mentored, 25 home/cell groups were held. Evangelism- 39 orphanage visits, 4 mission teams hosted. Administration- Missionaries- 1 involved in administration and planning of outreach activities.

Evangelism-6 orphanage visits, 24 missions teams hosted, 4 crusades held, 19 medical clinics held, 3 street ministry teams.
